### **Statement**

**Treaty One Territory, Manitoba** – The Assembly of Manitoba Chiefs (AMC) releases the following statement:

The press release issued today by Arlen Dumas was made with no association and is independent of the Assembly of Manitoba Chiefs.

The vote of non-confidence will proceed in a closed meeting, in accordance with the Executive Council of Chiefs' resolution following the independent workplace investigation, which found that the actions of Arlen Dumas amounted to workplace sexual harassment. This vote is in alignment with the procedures set out under the constitution of the AMC.

We are committed to providing an update regarding the vote of non-confidence as soon as it becomes available, which we anticipate will be late Friday afternoon.

The AMC was formed in 1988 by the Chiefs in Manitoba to advocate on issues that commonly affect First Nations in Manitoba. AMC is an authorized representative of 62 of the 63 First Nations in Manitoba with a total of more than 151,000 First Nation citizens in the province, accounting for approximately 12 percent of the provincial population. AMC represents a diversity of Anishinaabe (Ojibway), Nehetho / Ininew (Cree), Anishinew (Ojibwe-Cree), Denesuline (Dene) and Dakota Oyate (Dakota) people.
